Spiritual

- 1. Models a consistent daily walk with Jesus Christ in speech, actions, attitudes
- 2. Sets example of the importance of prayer, Scripture memorization and study, witnessing, and unity in Christian fellowship
- 3. Implements "body-life" principles as they relate to the spiritual well-being of students, parents, and staff
- 4. Follows Matthew 18 and Matthew 5 principles in dealing with students, parents administration, and staff
- 5. Shows support for the role of parents as primarily responsible before God for their children's education, and assists them in the task
- 6. Encourages students to accept God's gift of salvation and grow in their faith
- 7. Emphasizes to students the reality of their self-worth in Christ

Instructional

- 1. Integrates biblical principles and the Christian philosophy of education throughout the curriculum
- 2. Demonstrates mastery of the subject matter
- 3. Uses valid teaching techniques to achieve curriculum goals and promote student learning
- 4. Teaches classes as assigned by the administrator following prescribed scope and sequence
- 5. Plans broadly through the use of semester and quarterly plans and objectives and more currently through the use of a lesson plan book
- 6. Regularly updates the appropriate curricular documents pertaining to teaching assignments
- 7. Plans a program of study that, as much as possible, meets the individual needs, interests, and abilities of the students, challenging each to do his or her best work
- 8. Prepares and submits weekly lesson plans for the administrator's review
- 9. Employs a variety of instructional aids, methods, and materials that will provide for creative teaching to reach the whole child spiritual, intellectual, physical, social, emotional
- 10. Plans, through approved channels, the balanced use of field trips, guest lecturers, and other medial
- 11. Uses homework effectively for drill, review, enrichment, or project work
- 12. Assesses the learning of students on a regular basis and provides progress reports as required
- 13. Keeps proper discipline in the classroom and on the school premises for a good teaching environment

Non-instructional and Professional

- 1. Cooperates with the board and administration in implementing all policies, procedures, and directives governing the operation of the school
- 2. Maintains regular and accurate attendance and grade records to meet the demand for a comprehensive knowledge of each student's progress

- 3. Keeps students, parents, and the administration adequately informed of deficiencies and gives sufficient notice of failure
- 4. Maintains a clean, attractive, well-ordered classroom
- 5. Accepts a share of responsibility for extracurricular activities as assigned
- 6. Utilizes educational opportunities and evaluation processes for professional growth
- 7. Seeks the counsel of the administrator, colleagues, and parents, and is teachable
- 8. Provides input and recommendations for administrative and managerial functions in the school
- 9. Attends and participates in scheduled devotional, committee, faculty, and parent meetings
- 10. Demonstrates knowledge of procedures for dealing with emergencies
- 11. Contributes to the general improvement of the school program
- 12. Refuses to use or circulate confidential information inappropriately
- 13. Understands the importance of and adheres to the terms of the contract

- 2. Shows high esteem for others and their time by being punctual
- 3. Meets everyday stress with emotional stability, objectivity, and optimism

- 5. Submits respectfully and is loyal to constituted authority
- 6. Maintains a personal appearance that is a role model of cleanliness, modesty, and good taste
- 7. Uses acceptable English in written and oral communication; speaks with clear articulation
- 8. Develops and maintains rapport with student, parents, and staff to promote a positive learning environment
- 9. Recognizes the need for good public relations; represents the school in a favorable and professional manner to its constituency and the general public
